### President's report: (Andrew Lockley)

### **4WD Association**

#### **AGM/Quarterly Meeting**

Kevin advised the 4WD Association Quarterly Meeting and AGM is scheduled for Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> November and he will be attending the meeting via Zoom.

#### **Outsourcing of Office Administrative functions**

Kevin advised that certain office administrative functions of the 4WD Association were temporarily outsourced earlier this year on a “value for money” basis. This will be formalised through a Request For Tender process in the near future.

### ***Motor Council - Historic Vehicle Registration***

This year, the Council has primarily been in negotiation with the ACT Government on the detail of the new schemes and the development of an agreed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Council and the ACT Government. This newly developed MOU will be the reference document for the new scheme and has been a substantial task in its own right. The new system requires the development of a new logbook, the design and format of which have also been progressed this year.

The reason the new system has not been put in place is due to circumstances beyond the Council's control as every requirement and concern raised by the relevant Government departments have been met. The proposal, MOU and related aspects will then progress through the machinery of government and the bureaucracy with hopefully a successful implementation in the near future.

Garry also understands that there is to be a significant announcement regarding the Historic Vehicle Registration next Thursday.

### **What 3 words**


